American Society of Neurorehabilitation

Overview

The title of Fellow of the American Society of Neurorehabilitation is reserved for individuals who have contributed significantly to the field of Neurorehabilitation, and to the American Society of Neurorehabilitation. The title is an honor bestowed by the Society, but the recipients have no additional rights or privileges within the organization. The award is expected to be given to a limited number of recipients. The ASNR will keep a list of fellows in the central office, and the list should also be posted on the ASNR website.

Specific Criteria

1. Fellows must be a member of one of the membership categories of the ASNR and in good standing at the time of their selection.
2. Recipients should have evidence of significant contributions to the field of Neurorehabilitation. Contributions can be in any of the areas of research, teaching, service, administration, or a combination thereof.
3. In addition to service to the field of Neurorehabilitation, recipients should have evidence of contributions to the ASNR. This could include, but is not limited to, service as an officer, on the board of directors, on committees, or the involvement with the ASNR Foundation.

Selection Process

1. The ASNR office will seek nominations from the general membership on an annual basis, at least four months prior to the annual meeting. A list of nominees will be presented to the general membership who will be responsible for selection by electronic ballot, which will be sent back to the central office.
2. The two individuals with the highest number of votes will be selected and notified prior to the annual meeting.
3. The two annual recipients will be honored at the national meeting, preferably during an award ceremony as part of a social event. The presentation can be combined with other awards or presentations given by the ASNR, or another organization co-sponsoring the annual meeting.
4. The awardee will receive a plaque or certificate attesting to their choice as a fellow of the ASNR.
5. The designation of a Fellow is a lifetime award and may be awarded only once to a single individual.

Past-Presidents of ASNR are automatically awarded the FASN designation and do not count toward the two annual nominees/recipients from the membership at-large.
