Responsibilities include: • Collaborating with Department leadership and faculty to determine course content in the areas of neuroscience and neuromuscular physical therapy; • Participating in DPT instruction and advisement in neuroscience and neuromuscular physical therapy course sequence; • Participating in teaching in the post-professional Master of Science in Physical Therapy and undergraduate rehabilitation science programs; • Engaging in scholarship related to neuroscience and/or neuromuscular physical therapy. • Service on committees relevant to the research and teaching mission of the Department, School, and University.
