
Join Us in San Antonio for ASNR 2024!

ASNR Annual Meetings bring together a diverse and welcoming community of scientists, clinicians, industry professionals, and funders each year to share ideas and have important conversations about



how we can advance neurorehabilitation. At this year's meeting, we are thrilled to feature sessions that will cover a diverse range of topics, including research on multiple sclerosis, stroke, and spinal cord injury. The scientific program includes roundtable discussions, career development sessions, symposia, and poster sessions. Since this is a single-track conference focusing on neurorehabilitation, attendees will participate in all conference sessions together, providing excellent opportunities for discussion and exchange of ideas between individuals from different disciplines and research areas within the field.

The meeting will begin on Thursday morning, April 11th, with stimulating discussions during our professional development roundtable sessions. Thursday afternoon's program includes scientific symposia, oral abstracts, and an interactive poster session combined with our opening reception. Throughout the meeting there will be ample opportunities for networking and conversation during interactive sessions, meals, breaks, and the offsite event.

On Friday, April 12th, there is a full day of programming including scientific presentations, professional development sessions, and our second poster session and reception. This year, we are particularly excited about the coordination between professional development and scientific sessions. For example, on Friday, attendees will have the opportunity to learn about 3-D markerless motion capture during the morning scientific sessions, and the professional development session to follow will include demonstrations of computer vision technologies and a group discussion about implementing this technology.

The scientific presentations on Saturday, April 13th, will focus on frontiers in neuroregeneration relevant to rehabilitation. Diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility (DEIA) are central to the values of ASNR, and we are thrilled to welcome Dr. Gladys Maestre to share her insights in our DEIA session. Dr. Maestre has a rich history of diversifying clinical research in dementia, and she will lead a conversation on how we should begin to engage with the community in order to improve diversity in clinical trials. Our off-site event on Saturday afternoon will include a trip to the historic Alamo – which allows attendees to experience the culture and history of South Texas at one of its most iconic landmarks.
